The competition will be held in Cremona, Italy, from June 9 to 15 later this year, taking place in two local tennis clubs, with a total of 14 clay courts.

About the Invacare World Team Cup

Established in 1985, the Invacare World Team Cup was created as a fun tournament, which took place prior to the US Open. Initially a US-only event, the competition rapidly gained momentum until it moved outside the USA in 1992. Equivalent to the Davis Cup, the tournament is backed by the International Tennis Federation (ITF) and has carried the Invacare name for the past 12 years.

The Invacare World Team Cup is an extremely important event for Invacare. The flagship event perfectly embodies the company motto 'Yes, you can' and promotes an active and positive lifestyle.
